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#### 21. General Architectural Description

The Pollock House is located on the west side of Main Street. toward the north end of downtown Breckenridge. structure's east elevation is set back about 11' from the curb, fronting directly onto a concrete sidewalk paralleling the street. The original two-story, front gabled, portion of the building is nearly square, measuring 33' N-S by 32' E-W. A one-story, shed-roofed, addition to the south elevation measures 11' N-S by 32' E-W. There are also two gabled additions to the west (rear) elevation: the larger of the two additions, which measures 14' N-S by 16' E-W, was originally a separate building; this has been connected to the primary building by a small 10' by 5' gabled addition. All of the additions are well over fifty years old. The entire building is supported by a wood timbers on grade foundation. The building is of wood frame construction, with the exterior walls covered with rolled asphalt, in a faux brick pattern. The roofs are covered with rolled asphalt roofing material over 1x wood decking. A red brick chimney is located on the north facing roof slope. All of the building's windows have been covered over with vertical wood planks. Windows on the facade include two first story windows with pedimented arches, and two second story windows with flat arches. There are two window openings on the north elevation; one square window opening penetrates the west elevation of the gabled addition; two square window openings appear on the south elevation of the shed-roofed addition. Two sets of paired vertical wood plank doors, both side hinged with metal strap hinges, are located on the east elevation. opening onto the sidewalk along Main Street. A painted green wood-paneled door, with a wood screen door, enters the gabled addition at the far west end of the north elevation. Two wooden signboards over the building's main entry on the facade advertises:

# 42. Statement of Significance

This property is historically significant under National Register of Historic Places Criterion A for its association with downtown Breckenridge's socioeconomic development beginning in 1862 and extending through the middle of the twentieth century. Having served as the Summit County Clerk and Recorder's Office, and later as a residence, this building has been part of the downtown Breckenridge landscape for well over a century. The building is also architecturally significant, relative to National Register Criterion C, because it is one of Breckenridge's earliest frame buildings, constructed with some of the first milled lumber to be brought to Breckenridge by pack train. Accordingly, this building is eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, as a contributing resource located within the Breckenridge Historic District. The property's combined levels of significance and integrity are probably not to the extent that it would qualify for individual National Register designation.

# 43. Assessment of historic physical integrity related to significance:

The Pollock House / Summit County Clerk and Recorder's Office has seen few alterations within the past fifty years. A gabled addition to the rear (originally a separate building) was, in earlier years, connected to this building by a short gabled extension. The building's asphalt siding appears quite old, but is obviously not original.
